supported by the late KS Narayanan, founder of Chemplast and co-founder of India Cements. Now his sons N Sankar and N Kumar are carrying on. The third generation is represented by Vijay Sankar.

"We take pride in spotting and nurturing talent. We like giving opportunity to budding cricketers. The first win in 1966-1967 was special. So was the second, when we won 10 of 11 games," recollected Sankar.
