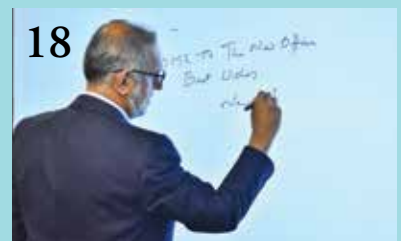

Chemplast Sanmar's new Speciality Paste PVC Resin plant at Cuddalore



Chairman of The Sanmar Group, Vijay Sankar, formally inaugurated the state-of-the-art Speciality paste PVC plant at Cuddalore on April 27, 2024.

Chemplast Sanmar's new plant at Cuddalore can produce 41,000 TPA of speciality paste PVC resin, in addition to the 66,000 TPA of speciality paste PVC resin facility at Mettur.

The Cuddalore plant has been set up at an investment of ₹ 3.6 bn.

Jolly Rovers clinch Palayampatti **Both Sanmar teams in the TNCA**

As one of the most successful teams in the history of the TNCA first division league, the Sanmar family-owned Jolly Rovers Cricket Club has continued its winning streak this year.

It has retained the prestigious Rajah of Palayampatti Shield and won the title for the 23rd time since 1966. Its' victory over Alwarpet Cricket Club by an innings and 14 runs underscores its dominance and consistency in the tournament.

This is the second time in the league's history that two teams owned by the same firm have reached the finals. Jolly Rovers and Alwarpet CC also clashed in the finals of the TNCA first-division cricket league in the 2018-19 season.

Jolly Rovers' achievements are unparalleled. Since its establishment in 1966, the team has amassed an impressive 70 titles. Notably, it has clinched the esteemed Raja of Palayampatti Trophy 23 times and the prestigious VAP trophy 9 times, a testament to its consistent success since the 2005-06 season.

Jolly Rovers player **B Sai Sudharsan** won the Cricketer of the Year (2023-24) award for the second successive time in the 92nd annual day function of the Tamil Nadu Cricket Association held at the MA Chidambaram stadium on June 1, 2024. Sai Sudharsan received the award from WV Raman, the former Indian Cricketer.

Sai Sudharsan is known for his prolific performances in first-class and List-A cricket. He also plays for India in international cricket.

Rithik Easwaran, a sought-after wicketkeeper batsman in Tamil Nadu, is an exciting prospect who led the Alwarpet CC team into the finals of the Tamil Nadu Cricket Association league 2023/24.

Rithik has been a consistent performer for 2 seasons (2022/23 and 2023/24). He had a good 2022/23 league season and scored 548 runs with five fifties at an average of 45.67 and a wonderful 2023/24 league season and scored 820 runs at an average of 45.56 with six fifties and two hundreds. His knocks of 97 not out & 84 against Vijay CC (India Cements) stood out in the season.

For his consistent performances, Rithik is being graduated to Jolly Rovers and believe that he will move on to greater heights.

His outstanding contributions with the bat earned him the prestigious PC Ramudu Endowment from TNCA for the highest run aggregate in the first division.

Baba Indrajith received the 'Ranji Consistent Performer' award from WV Raman at the TNCA Annual Day 2024. Indrajith is also the captain of the Jolly Rovers CC, the first-division champions this year.

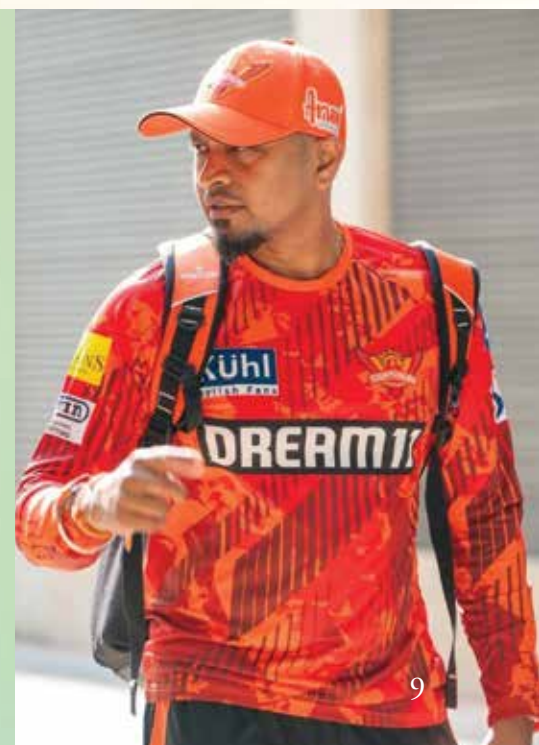

Jolly Rovers' top order comprising the likes of B Aparajith, the skipper himself, Vimal Khumar, G Ajitesh, Dhruv Shorey clicked as a unit and played a role in several of their victories. "Our top order has a good combination of senior players and youngsters. Everybody was hungry to get runs. I didn't have to say much to them. It was a collective effort. achievements and credits his good performance to his coach R Ram Kumar who is a former left-arm spinner for Tamil Nadu. "I'm delighted to be a part of this team. We have been working so hard as a team, and as individuals, and as a result, we got this victory. Regular practice, discipline, and consistency made me successful. I am also working with Ram Kumar *anna* who is the bowling coach for Jolly Rovers team. He helped me a lot with my skills," he says.

Chandrasekar last played for Tamil Nadu in 2015. He wants to use his consistent performance in the league and try to get back into the state team again. "My love for cricket motivates me every day to focus on the game and enjoy it. I'm looking forward to representing the state again soon. I'm thankful to Bharath Reddy sir, Ajay Kuduva sir, Chemplast management, co-players, and support staff; without them, I would not have been able to bowl so well this season," he signs off.

Chemplast Sanmar Ltd has said its Custom Manufactured Chemicals Division (CMCD) has signed a Letter of Intent (LoI) with an undisclosed global agrochemical innovator to manufacture a new pipeline active ingredient (AI).

The LoI covers five years. Commercial supplies are expected to start from CY 2025. This new product will be manufactured in Phase 2 of its new multi-purpose production block which will be commissioned in this quarter, according to a statement.

"We have signed another LoI for the supply of an advanced intermediate for a

new pipeline AI. This is the 4th LoI we have signed since we commenced our expansion journey in this division. This development further reiterates our customers' confidence in Chemplast Sanmar's wide range of chemical processes and R&D capabilities," said Krishna Kumar Rangachari, Deputy Managing Director, Chemplast Sanmar Ltd.

The Custom Manufactured Chemicals Division of the company produces advanced intermediates and active ingredients for global agrochemical, pharmaceutical, and fine chemical innovators. The division has invested in modern production blocks, a pilot plant, and R&D facilities to handle a wide range of chemistries and processes.

'Raga' joins Sanmar Shipping's expanding fleet

Sanmar Shipping added the Sanmar Raga to its now expanding Gas Fleet, in May 2024. With the addition of Sanmar Raga, under the Singapore Flag, Sanmar Shipping has made inroads into the Singapore Registry, with three ships in all. Sanmar Shipping now has three gas carriers and 11 product tankers.

Raga, formally Clipper Helen, is a 18,110 DWT, built to a good standard by Neptun Werft GmbH, in Germany, the vessel is classed with Det Norske Veritas (DNV).

The vessel is an LPG Carrier driven by a controllable pitch propeller, fitted to

a Wartsila Main Engine. The vessel is fitted with energy saving devices of a rudder bulb and pre-swirl device.

Apart from the equipment required by international rules and regulations, the bridge is also fitted with differential-GPS, and the engine room and machinery are fitted with an engine power limiter, incinerator sludge burning system, UMS capabilities, 2-stroke engine Alpha lubricator, centralised seawater cooling and dual air handling unit refrigeration compressors along with and IMO approved Ballast Water Treatment system. The vessel is also equipped with a robust cargo handling system.

The vessel remains Classed with Det Norske Veritas and is a Semi-Pressurised/Semi-Refrigerated LPG Carrier equipped with 3 sets of cargo tanks and 2 deck tanks which can carry up to 2 segregations of cargo and with ethylene carrying capabilities, which makes it very versatile for future trading of VCM.

Legends from the South

Vani Jairam: The Melody Queen of South India

Vani Jairam, an illustrious figure in the Indian music industry, is revered as one of the most versatile and accomplished playback singers in South India. Her mellifluous voice, extensive repertoire, and remarkable contribution to Indian music cemented her legendary status. Over a career spanning several decades, Vani Jairam's melodious renditions captivated the hearts of millions, transcending linguistic and regional boundaries.

Early Life and Musical Journey:

Born on November 30, 1945, in Vellore, Tamil Nadu, Vani Jairam,

originally named Kalaivani, displayed an innate talent for music from a young age. She grew up in a musically inclined family, which nurtured her passion for singing. Her father, Duraisamy Iyer, was an accomplished musician, and her mother, Padmavathi, was a veena player.

Vani's early exposure to classical music laid the foundation for her illustrious career. Vani Jairam's formal training began under the guidance of RS Mani, a renowned music teacher in Chennai.

She further honed her skills under the tutelage of Kadalur Srinivasa Iyengar and TR Balasubramanian, eminent exponents of Carnatic music. Her rigorous training in classical music endowed her with a deep understanding of ragas and an impeccable control over her voice, which would later become her hallmark.

Vani was glued to the Radio Ceylon channel and was attracted to the Hindi film songs to the extent that she memorised and reproduced the entire orchestration of the songs that used to play on the radio repeatedly. At 8, she had her first public performance at the All India Radio, Madras. Vani did her schooling at Lady Sivaswamy High School, Chennai.

She then graduated from the Queen Mary's College, Madras. After her studies, Vani was employed by the State Bank of India, Madras. After



marrying Jairam in 1969, she moved to Mumbai to set up her family.

Rise to Stardom:

Vani Jairam's entry into the playback singing arena was marked by her debut in the 1971 Hindi film "Guddi," where she sang the iconic song "Bole Re Papihara," composed by the legendary Vasant Desai. This song catapulted her to instant fame.

For the song "Mere To Giridhar Gopal" in Meera (1979), composed by Pandit Ravi Shankar, she won her first Filmfare Award for Best Female Playback Singer.

Her unique voice, characterised by its clarity and emotive quality, set her apart from her contemporaries.

Following her success in Bollywood, Vani Jairam made a triumphant entry into the South Indian film industry.
