30 years on, Davy's extradition in Purulia case is a 'work in progress'

Extradition of Danish national Niels Holck or Kim Peter Davy, prime accused in the nearly three-decade-old Purulia arms drop case, is not a "political topic" but has to be dealt with "among the proper authorities", visiting Denmark Foreign Affairs Minister Lars Lokke Rasmussen said on Tuesday.

Davy had publicly accepted that he was behind the airdrop of AK-47s and ammunition but stated that "political forces" were behind the conspiracy to destabilise the then Left government in West Bengal. But the CBI had dismissed the claim due to lack of evidence.

'NOT POLITICAL'

The Denmark minister's statement during his ongoing visit to the national capital, therefore, marks a shift in his country's outlook towards one of the most serious global conspiracies to destabilise the country. "When I visited India back in 2019, in my previous capacity as PM, we talked about it. We had indepth discussion at the political level and we agreed this is not a political topic," Denmark Foreign Affairs Minister said to a query on Davy's extradition.

BILATERAL RELATIONS

Way back in 2012, India had scaled down its diplomatic engagement with Denmark after it refused to appeal in its Supreme Court against a subordinate court's ruling against his extradition.

The cordial relations between the two countries were restored only in 2017 after a Danish minister came to India.

A Danish team had visited Kolkata, last February, to take feedback on the arms drop court trial and the prison infrastructure. The Denmark officials reportedly enquired about jail conditions to give a report to their government given that Davy has been able to stall his extradition in courts there on a plea that his human rights would be violated due to Indian prison conditions - a plea other criminals on the run and hiding in western countries have also adopted.

Co-accused Peter Bleach, a British national who was convicted in the case, had alleged that it was an operation of India's external spy agency, Research And Analysis Wing (R&AW), to destabilise the Left regime in West Bengal.

Danfoss, IIT-Madras join hands for wave energy-powered desalination

Danish company Danfoss, which has operations in India, today tied-up with the Indian Institute of Technology Madras, for collaborative research on sea water desalination using energy from sea waves.

Danfoss and IIT-M exchanged two agreements for collaboration to promote research in the areas of securing drinking water for coastal regions using renewable energy and green fuels including green hydrogen for value creation in pursuance to the Green Strategic Partnership between India and Denmark.

Danfoss and IIT-M will operate a pilot desalination plant to use ocean waves as an energy source to convert salt water into fresh water us-

Under the Innovation

Fund Denmark (IFD) and Department of Science & Technology (DST), Danfoss and IIT Madras are collaborating on a R&D project to develop grid friendly [EcoGrif] Power to X [PtX] Converters suited to Indian and the global markets.

FOUR MOUS

IIT Madras today signed two more agreements with another Danish company, F L Smidth.

One of the MoUs with FL Smidth was for 'decarbonisation of cement industry' using pyrolysis of waste fuels. The other was for the Danish company to become a member of IIT Madras' Energy Consortium.

Manu Santhanam, Associate Dean, Industrial Consultancy & Sponsored Research, IIT-Madras, told businessline that under these MoUs, the Danish companies will initiate the research projects and IIT Madras will offer technical assistance "with clear guidelines and deliverables."

tial in sharing mutual knowledge with India and its bright engineers, which can help in implementing these technologies," Lars Aagaard, Minister for Climate, Energy and Utilities, Government of Denmark, said.

"Tamil Nadu has identified 15 offshore locations to establish wind turbines. Denmark is collaborating on a plan to establish the first wind farm offshore in Tamil Nadu. I have a strong belief that we can support one another in developing these technologies while learning how they can be implemented in different contexts." he added.

S. Krishnan, Additional Chief Secretary, Department of Industries, Investment Promotion and Commerce, Tamil Nadu, said the State was working on a green hydrogen policy. Four projects were announced and memoranda of understanding signed. IIT Madras will collaborate with Danish researchers on a hydrogen economy project. Another project pertains to cement decarbonisation.

Technology firm FLSmidth has joined the Energy Consortium-IIT Madras as the founding member. Another multinational, Danfoss, and IIT Madras will jointly work on a project to supply drinking water to coastal regions using renewable energy.

The Crown Prince and Princess also met Governor R.N. Ravi at Raj Bhavan.

Letter of intent signed with Danish govt. agency

The Water Resources Department and the Municipal Administration and Water Supply Department are looking to strengthen bilateral ties with Denmark in the water sector.

A letter of intent for sustainable growth was signed with the Danish Environmental Protection Agency. The Danish agency would support, and share technology for various initiatives like rejuvenation of rivers and waterbodies and the Internet of Thingsbased sensors for groundwater quality monitoring and piped water supply to households.

At a meeting on water sector cooperation, Sandeep Saxena, Additional Chief Secretary, WRD, recalled his visit to Denmark last year. There had been close interaction with the Danish team for the past two years, and one of the major initiatives was the sharing of Danish technology for detailed groundwater mapping in the State.

Lauding the water quality of rivers in Denmark, he said, "It is our dream to improve water quality in the Cooum and Adyar and Buckingham Canal to bathing standards. We are also learning about the Danish subsurface database maintained on borewells dug in the country." The Danish team, headed by Christian Vindahl Vind, Permanent Secretary of State, Ministry of Environment, also visited the 45-mld tertiary treatment reverse osmosis plant at Kovambedu.

Chennai: Energy efficiency solutions company, Danfoss has entered into an MoU with IIT Madras for promoting research in water and energy sectors.

Denmark to help TN set up its first offshore wind farm

THE Indian Institute of Technology, Madras (IIT-M) has partnered with Denmark for research in climate change mitigation and green transition, which includes development of next generation fuels and energy systems. Danish minister Lars Aagaard said that Denmark is collaborating with Tamil Nadu to establish the first offshore wind farm in the state.

The MoUs were exchanged in the backdrop of Denmark crown prince Frederik André Henrik Christian, minister Lars Aagaard and Danish energy delegation's visit to IIT-M research park. Senior officials from the Tamil Nadu government and IIT-M dean (industrial consultancy and sponsored research) Manu Santhanam, among others, were present at the event.

Speaking on next generation fuels, Lars Aagaard said, "Today, Denmark is paving the way for investments in new technologies, which must scale. We see great potential in sharing mutual knowledge with India and its bright engineers, which can help in implementing these technologies."

"Tamil Nadu has a renewable energy installed capacity of 20GW, of which 10GW is from wind. There is potential for another 13GW of wind energy onshore and 20GW offshore," said S Krishnan, additional chief secretary, Tamil N a d u I n d u s t r i e s Department.

According to a release from IIT-M, an MoU was signed under Indo-Danish Green Strategic Partnership for four projects, of which three focus on the energy sector. The projects will be jointly funded by the Innovation Fund Denmark (IFD) and Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India.
